# **RAINBOW CONNECTION**

## Anglican Cursillo Tasmania

A Reflection on Romans 8: 35-39 and 2 Corinthians 1: 20-23 from Diocesan Spiritual Advisor Peter Johnson (full transcript at cursillotasmania.org.au)

Peter begins by saying that he just can't help thinking about St Paul with all that is going on in the world. For many weeks we have needed to hide from each other. Most of us have been physically inconvenienced and emotionally strained. The cause of all is the minute thing called a Coronavirus. We have been under threat; the threat of sickness or death and the threat of losing loved ones. Peter says this has been going on since the beginning of time. Nothing has changed other than the title of the present invader. Peter reflects on the first passage of scripture from Romans which is used a lot at funerals,

'Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written: "for your sake we face death all day long: we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered". No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord'.

Peter emphasises that neither death nor life will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Despite any threat from danger or whatever, despite the Coronavirus with all its power and venom, nothing can overcome the love of Christ. How can we be sure of this? Paul explains when writing to the people of Corinth,

'For no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" in Christ. And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God. Now it is God who makes both us and you stand firm in Christ. He anointed us, set his seal of ownership on us, and put his spirit in our hearts as a deposit, promising what is to come.'

Peter says 'wow!' This not something just for the future, this is for now. God's promise for forgiveness, healing, blessing and hope have already been fulfilled in Christ. They are here with us right now. Peter wants us to keep this knowledge of the presence of God with us **all** the time. Let's rejoice and look around at whatever the world can throw at us and happily keep in our minds that we have this promise.



### Update on Mez Thomas (Tas Cursillista in London)

Mez is a NHS nurse who was re-deployed for a while to work with the Covid patients on ventilation at the Nightingale field hospital. Due to a Government decision the Nightingale was shut down at very short notice and the patients were sent to other hospitals. Mez and the other NHS staff were sent back to their former jobs, again at very short notice. Mez received a text message on her day off from Night-ingale to return to her Clinic work the day after her time off. It was a week of very mixed emotions for her. Although Mez enjoys her Clinic work, her time working in ICU had given her space to re-consider her working life and consider God's plans for her future. For a while Mez has wondered about full time ministry. Perhaps God is leading her in that direction. Mez is starting to explore and find out more. She would value prayers for discernment and timing in all these decisions.
